Continued Modernization

- Completed overhaul of accreditation process, organizational structure and quality management
 - successful peer evaluation by IAF in Sept 2014
 - increased customer satisfaction (by more than 14 pts)
 - streamlined QMS (reduced # of documents by 2/3)
- Next steps include
 - implementation of a business solution (IT)
 - finalize the review of all CAN-PS
 - peer evaluation by ILAC in August 2015

CBAP: Update and Transition to ISO/IEC 17065 and CAN-P-1500:2013

- As of June 2015, 37 CABs accredited by SCC in various sectors
- 5 applicants in the process
- ISO/IEC 17065 and CAN-P-1500:2013
 - Transition needs to be completed by Sept 14, 2015 as per IAF
 - Transition plan of SCC requires closure of all non-conformities by July 31, 2015
 - To date 20 have transitioned to ISO/IEC 17065
 - Activities have taken place to complete transition on time



Initiatives to watch....

- SCC to Scope CB Accreditation by standards instead of ICS codes
 - Complete lists of standards and ORDs have been received
 - Verification being made
 - Phased in implementation
- ORD Task Force (second part of this presentation)



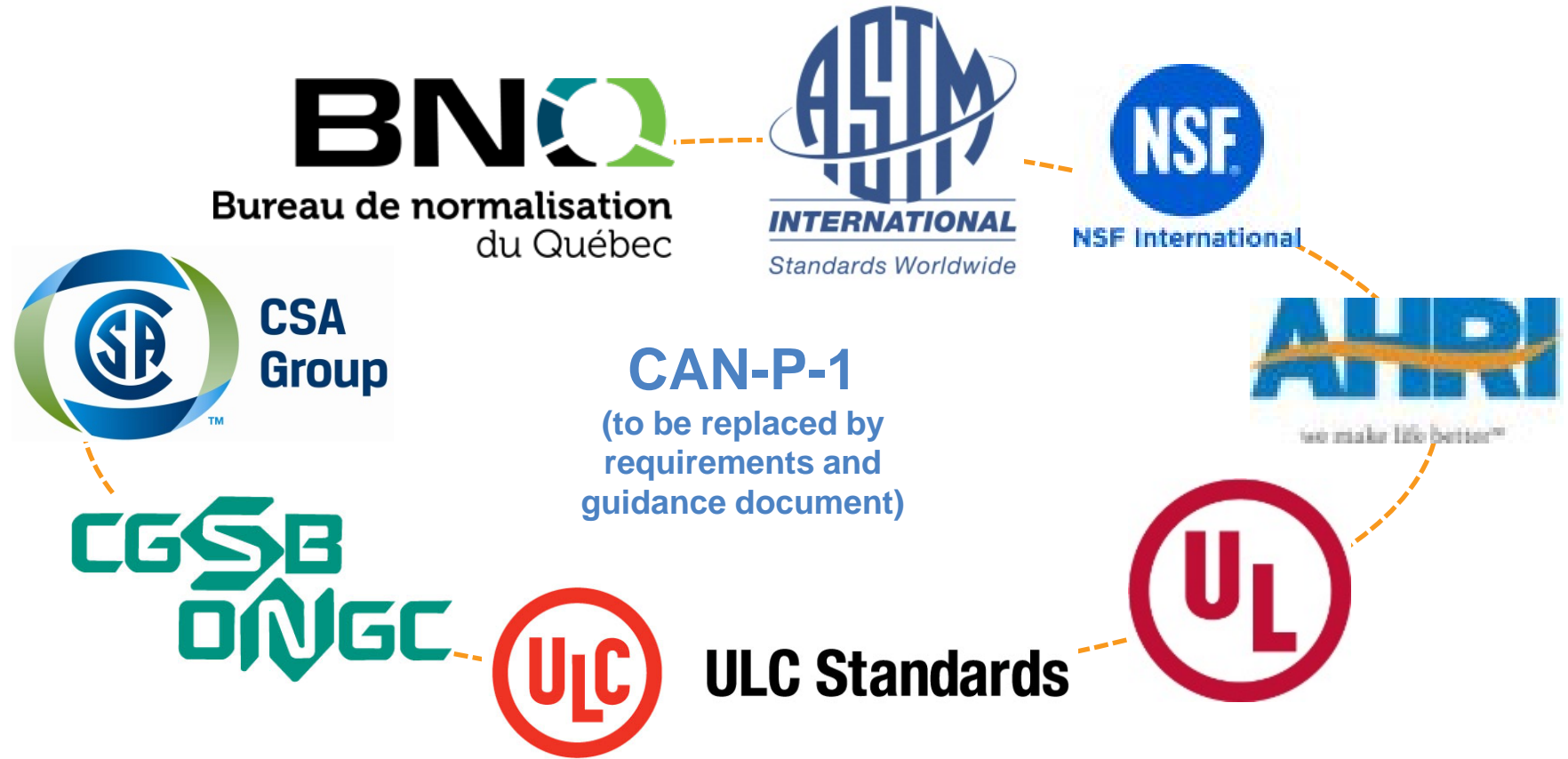
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STANDARD DEVELOPMENT ORGANIZATION PROGRAM UPDATE

Context

- ORD
 - Definition: A document developed by a certification body, in the absence of a recognized Canadian standard, in order to establish safety and performance criteria for a new product. The ORD is intended to provide Regulatory Authorities with assurance that a level of safety or performance, which is equal to that of existing standards for similar functions, is being maintained.
- Meant as a temporary solution until a standard can be developed.
- Used in P/T regulations across a variety of sector, particularly in electrical safety.



Context

- SCC-accredited Certification Bodies (CBs) develop ORDs.
- The process for developing ORDs has been imbedded in SCC's technical requirements for the certification of products (CAN-P-1500).
- Typically endorsed by relevant Regulatory Authority Advisory Bodies (RAABs), then communicated to SCC to allow CBs to certify to the ORD



Problem Identification / Impacts

- Expired ORDs

- ORDs meant to last 5 years continue to be used with no attempt to develop a standard

Impact: Expired ORDs may not reflect latest technology and needs. ORDs have not been developed using a consensus-based, balanced matrix and should not be viewed as a long-term solution.

- Governance

- Lack of delegated authority of RAAB members
- Confusion around roles and responsibilities

Impact: Increased liability if ORDs have not been endorsed by representatives with delegated authority. Lack of clarity increases risk of duplication and does not promote accountability.



Problem Identification / Impacts

- Transparency

- Unclear membership of RAABs, both regulator and non-regulator
- Unclear voting requirements/procedures
- SCC not informed of decisions

Impact: Endorsement of ORDs may occur with conflicts of interest. Voting issues (e.g. voting of non-regulatory members, lack of documentation) may still result in endorsed ORDs.

- Process

- No formal relationship between SCC and RAABs
- Regulators lack awareness of national implications of ORD endorsement

Impact: Lack of communication between RAABs, regulators, and SCC. Unclear how, where, when and why ORDs are endorsed



ORD Task Force

- Created in 2013 with mandate to review and revise the current ORD process.
 - Process from inception to endorsement
 - Objective of creating a baseline document to be used by all sectors, making the process relevant, consistently applied, lean, simple, efficient and transparent to all stakeholders.
- Membership: regulators, industry, industry associations, CBs
- Secretariat: SCC



ORD Task Force

- Update to NPSAC at May 2014 meeting in Ottawa
- ORD Task Force has now completed the final report: “Guidelines for the Development and Maintenance of Other Recognized Documents (ORDs)”



Final Report of ORD Task Force

- Final report proposes processes for:
 - Development of new ORDs
 - Maintenance of Existing ORDs
 - Disposition of ORDs
- Flowcharts available in Final Report



Final Report of ORD Task Force

- Important concepts:
 - RAABs as Acknowledging Bodies
 - Onus of evidence on CB/manufacturer
 - Public access of validation status and scope
 - Reaffirmation v. Revalidation
 - Superseded v. Expired v. Withdrawal



Memoranda of Understanding with RAABs

- SCC will pursue a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) in support of the new ORD process to be negotiated with each acknowledging body
- NPSAC's role will be recognized in that MOU
- Acknowledging bodies will include CACES, IGAC, CACP/CRCP, CACEE, CDW, PTPACC, APCEI, ACI, etc.



Next Steps / Timelines

- Document endorsed in principles by NPSAC at their May meeting
- NPSAC in support of SCC reaching out to RAABs to sign MOUs
- Final “Guidelines for the Development and Maintenance of Other Recognized Documents (ORDs)” published (June, 2015)
- SCC to present MOU at upcoming meeting of CACES on June 18, 2015. MOU with CACES target completion date Sep 1, 2015. Subsequent six months for the development of a mechanism to address expired ORDs



Next Steps / Timelines (continued)

- SCC to discuss MOUs and associated implementation with other RAABs through fiscal year 2015-16
- Report back to NPSAC on progress at autumn 2015 meeting
