The Standards Council of Canada (SCC) is the federal government's accreditation body. SCC accreditation instantly increases the credibility of your organization and the testing or certification services that it offers.

Canada's food and water safety systems industry is one of many industries for which SCC <u>accredits conformity assessment bodies</u>—such as testing laboratories and product certification bodies—to internationally recognized standards.

For more than 15 years, we have been helping to ensure the quality of testing results for drinking water. SCC is one of Canada's national <u>accreditation bodies for environmental testing</u> laboratories. As well, we accredit certification bodies for <u>food safety management</u> <u>systems</u>, to the international standard ISO/IEC 17021, *Conformity assessment – Requirements for bodies providing audit and certification of management systems*, and we accredit testing laboratories that test food for dangerous bacteria and other harmful substances.
